- v) **Treasurer (Alyson Whitaker)** – Each of you must have received a quarterly report. Brief information about the many ways SGCC raises money for the school. Walk-A-Thon, Spring fundraiser, E Scrip program, Target Redcard, Corporate Matchinf etc.
TDF: All of the returning teachers this year received \$300 this year from SGCC + the money each teacher earned through TWT. We have one new teacher joining the staff this year(5th grade teacher) and SGCC is supporting her by giving her \$700 in addition to the \$300 to start the class off (a total of \$1000). We had two teachers swap grade levels this year (K/1 and 4th Grade). There are basic set up expenses that come with a new classroom so SGCC provided these two teachers with additional \$350 each.
In regards to the decision of how to spend the money raised, SGCC goes through a pretty extensive budget process. The budget period runs from Nov1 st -Oct 31st. This allows time in the first few weeks of school for the teachers to formulate ideas about the needs they see. The Ball Wall, Track etc were brought to fruition this way through the support of local businesses and SGCC. If anyone is interested in being a part of the budget committee please sign up during the October meeting. There will be a couple of Budget committee meetings in October to discuss priorities and formulate a preliminary budget for the year and it will be presented at the November meeting for a membership vote of approval.
